4.2 Kerry Bateman – 26661

Mr Bateman spoke to his submission regarding the need to stimulate the use of public transport via a clearway system with priority lanes and provision of park and ride facilities at Quarantine Road and in Stoke, with frequent shuttles to Nelson CBD. He answered questions regarding his submission.

4.3 Gillian Wratt – Nelson Tasman Cycle Trails Trust - 26876

Ms Wratt provided a PowerPoint presentation (A2608661) and spoke to the Trust's submission regarding the need for more emphasis on linking active transport outside urban areas, including the Tasman District, and answered questions regarding the submission.

4.4 Peter Olorenshaw – Nelsust – 26947

Mr Olorenshaw provided a PowerPoint presentation (A2610282) and spoke to the submission. He felt that the RLTP did not reflect the current goal of a mode shift and asked how this would happen without adequate investment in cycle paths. He spoke of coastal shipping and a lack of budget for Rocks Road and suggested the reframing of the Plan's objectives to prosperity, not GDP. He answered questions regarding the submission.
