Community Pre-Engagement Feedback Summary: Weeklong Session I

Below is a summary of discussions from the 27 representatives from 13 Community Groups that attended the pre-engagement sessions held at Trailways.

- Central themes and take-aways
- City Centre should be strongly people focused but will require behaviour change (vehicle movement and parking, attitudes, density, respect, equity, mobility, accessibility, age)
- Good support to consider how to re-prioritise streets for better people prioritised outcomes (e.g. proposals for pedestrian malls, ped arterials, shared spaces, linear parks, car-free or car-light streets, etc)
- Strong support for 10 Great Places and Laneway Network approaches
- More residential living and Science/Tech Precinct strongly supported
- Better linkages to river and green spaces
- Eclectic business recognised and celebrated
- · Stronger role for arts community in identity and placemaking
- Youth and aged need better offering in CC
- Activations in CC supported: events, conferences, activities and lingering
- Tell the successful stories!
- Trialling change supported. Build on our momentum
- Stronger identity needed in places, streets, squares
- Periphery parking support
