In order to prevent a return to the pre-Covid-19 homeless status quo, what was needed was somewhere homeless people could go during the day to use bathroom, laundry, kitchen, dining, and computer facilities.

The purpose of the facility should be guided by those who would be using it.

"Often as agencies we decide what people want without actually discussing with them – in this case we want to go back to the community to ask what they want."

Financial and technical support has also been offered from Nelson's Rotary Clubs.

Members of the Nelson's Rotary clubs began the first stage of physical work, which included clearing the site and preparing the foundations for a shed that was on site but is currently unable to be used.







Libraries – Borrowing Statistics and e-magazines



- We issued a total of 717,740 items from June 2021-June 2020 (physical and digital combined).
- That's up from 708,497 from June 2018-2019.
- There were 58,263 renewals for the same period.
- That's up from 28,467 from the previous year.
- There were 1468 e-magazine checkouts between February 2021 (when they became available) and June 2021, increasing month on month.





Arts

- Te Korowai Aroha / Welcome cloak installed at Greenmeadows.
- Murals by Hannah Staines and Nerys Ngaruhe completed on the Railway Reserve Underpass
- Make/Shift Spaces Art Walk launched with seed funding provided by Nelson City Council







Heritage

- Tuku 21 was very successful with 69 events included greater cultural diversity than in previous years.
- Rutherford Cottage display which was completed in partnership with Rutherford Rotary opened at Founders on 13 April.
- Major refurbishment of the exterior Windmill completed.
- Founders Annual Book Fair raised \$141,000
- Cob repairs at Broadgreen House completed









The Events Team successfully held three Youth Events:

- April 10 Rock The City an allages music gig.
- May 7 Laugh Nelson a comedy show for 14–24-year-olds
- May 15 Young and Inspired had 8 young and inspiring presenters.

On June 24, The Events Team planned a Nelson Events Hui. The purpose of the hui is to share information, ideas, experience, and knowledge of the local events scene while developing Nelson's events network.
