Subject: Stoke Projects

Stoke Projects - for update to Community Services Committee

There are a number of projects underway, programmed or planned in Stoke that were included through the Long Term Plan 2018-28.

These include:

- Greenmeadows Community Centre completed 2018/19
- Stoke Skate ramp completed 2018/19 as the first stage of the Stoke Youth Park
- Stoke Youth Park Consultation will begin later this year with development of youth facilities proposed for 2020/21. All opportunities will be considered. Whanake Youth is carrying out a project looking at what Stoke young people want in their community and this work will feed into the Stoke Youth Park project. Whanake Youth are interested in staying involved in this project.
- Budgets \$51K in 2019/20, \$261K in 2020/21 and \$267K in 2021/22
- Stoke Library weather tightness some work carried out in 2018/19, further work required in 2019/20
- Stoke Library extension/relocation \$25K for investigation in 2019/20, capital for development of the library spread over 2021/22 to 2024/25. More consultation with the community is needed before this can be completed.
- Stoke Memorial Hall currently earthquake prone (24% NBS). Future of the Hall needs to be reviewed, with current earthquake strengthening not scheduled until 2024/25 although may need to be done earlier. Many users have relocated to Greenmeadows.
- Stoke Community Centre previously used by Stoke Seniors, now managed by CLM as a community
- Greenmeadows classification and Reserve Management Plan for sportsgrounds planned for 2019/20

In addition, there are transport projects and proposals for Strawbridge Square that are also underway outside of the delegation of the Community Services Committee.

Council also funds community organisations in Stoke through the Community Investment Fund and Youth Investment Funding. Most notably, Whananke Youth have been funded for two years to continue their work increasing services for health and wellbeing of young people, largely focussed in Stoke.

There is also a community group, Stoked, that will be consulted with.
