8. Environmental Management Fees and Charges Review 2021 - Deliberations Report

Group Manager Environmental Management, Clare Barton, presented the report and answered questions. Two corrections were noted to the options presented on agenda page 32:

- For option 1 the second bullet point in 'Risks and Disadvantages' should read: "Lost income of about \$4,000 which will need to be met by the General Rate. [Remainder of sentence removed.]"
- For option 3, the summary should read "Increase fees and charges (hourly rate \$162 and liecence fee \$255) (commencing 1 July 2021) recovering **51%** of the costs."
